
Accessibility

UIC Barcelona is continuously working on eliminating architectural barriers and enhancing accessibility across all its campuses in Barcelona (on Iradier Street and Terré Street) and in Sant Cugat. For wheelchair users, the university provides tables and chairs with movable wheels and legs in the workspace (Room 203).

For people with hearing impairment, the University has a fixed magnetic induction loop system at the entrance to the University and a mobile system in the Secretary's Office of the School of Architecture (1 transmitter with 2 receivers).

For visually impaired people, there are signs in the lifts and floor numbers in braille and high relief on all floors of the Alfa and Beta buildings at the Barcelona Campus. There is also braille and high relief signage in the facilities of the Alfa and Beta buildings at the Barcelona Campus.



Barcelona Campus – Immaculada

- Access ramp to the Auditorium
- Access ramp to the stage and the Main Hall from Beta 2
- Parking reserved for people with reduced mobility
- Adapted lifts
- Adapted restrooms for people with reduced mobility
- Access ramp from Alfa building -3 to parking with a 10% gradient for people with reduced mobility



Sant Cugat Campus

- Platform lift from floor -1 to Floor -2
- Adapted lifts
- Floor 0 is fully accessible
- Access ramp from c/ Josep Trueta
- · Every bathroom on campus is adapted for people with reduced mobility

Barcelona Campus – Terré

- · Outdoor ramp between Delta and Gamma buildings
- · Adapted lifts
- Access ramp to the stage in the Auditorium
- Every bathroom on campus is adapted for people with reduced mobility



UIC Barcelona has three campuses and each campus has 2 buildings which have approximately 6 floors each, which means that overall, UIC has 36 restrooms for people with reduced mobility throughout its facilities. Each floor of UIC Barcelona has an accessible restroom with ample space which makes it easier for a person in a wheelchair to enter the restroom. The restroom also has a metal railing attached to the wall that serves as a support so that people with disabilities can use the restroom by their own means with the security of a support.

All elevators are adapted, allowing for easy mobility around the university. There are many elevators throughout all our campuses. The elevators go from the second floor of the building to the top floor and have direct exits to the classrooms and facilities, so that people with disabilities are fully connected to every corner of the university. There are several mobility aids for people with reduced mobility at UIC Barcelona, as mentioned above, helping them move around the university by elevator or the ramps that are strategically and safely placed.
