

## Collaboration to promote good practices around the SDGs

1. **Kids Sustainability:** *The Kids Sustainability project, led by the Ignatianum University in Krakow (Poland), and the collaboration of LUMSA (Rome), the Polytechnic of Milan (Italy), Dublin City University (Ireland), and UIC Barcelona (Spain), aims to design research-based learning resources for educators, focusing on sustainability skills for children aged 3 to 6 years. The project repository houses practical learning resources designed to help teachers and parents identify and strengthen sustainability skills development practices and how to teach them.*



2. **Harmony-H2020 project.** In February 2023, the final training of the European project HARMONY-H2020 was carried out in the [Master's Degree in Urban Design for Healthy Cities](#) and the [Master's Degree in City Resilience Design and Management](#) of UIC Barcelona School of Architecture. This project, led by University College London and with the participation of 21 partners from nine European countries, seeks to drive a sustainable transition to a new era of low-carbon mobility in metropolitan areas. Students had the opportunity to train in the Harmony Model Suite, a platform that combines transport and space planning tools, which underlines the importance of these trainings for the development of sustainable mobility plans in cities.



3. **“One patient - one strategy. Individual Prevention at University”:** The bachelor's degree programme in Dentistry has also worked on integral sustainability through the event “One Patient-One Strategy. Individual Prevention in University”, in the 1st Edition of the Iberia Universities Forum. This pioneering forum, organised and sponsored by CURAPROX Spain, aims to train professionals in the importance of prevention in oral health. 19 national and international universities participated, including the University of Lyon, the University of Lisbon and the University of Coimbra. Among the speakers were lecturers from UIC Barcelona such as Dr Lluís Giner, Dr Silvia Albareda and Dr Alberto Monje.



4. **UIC Barcelona participates in the First International Congress on Sustainable Curriculum and SDGs in University Education.** UIC Barcelona had the honour of participating in the First International Congress on Curriculum Sustainability and SDGs in University Education, where strategies and methodologies to integrate the SDGs into

university educational programmes were discussed. This event highlighted the importance of a sustainable curriculum and provided a platform for the exchange of good practices among academic institutions around the world.



5. **BIODIG 2023: 5th International Conference on Biodigital Architecture and Genetics:** The [International Congress of Biodigital Architecture and Genetics \(BIODIG 2023\)](#), takes place every three years and is an important forum for international, multidisciplinary and interorganisational scientific exchange on areas related to biodigital architecture and design. This event brings together participants from all countries, strongly committed to the development of natural, computational and pioneering solutions to solve the problems of society, contributing to a better, more sustainable life.
  
6. **GREEN DIALOGUES** – Teacher Training in Children’s Environmental Literature: This project is a collaboration between the Western Norway University of Applied Sciences (HVL), the University of Padua (UNIPD) and UIC Barcelona. Its main objectives are to improve the quality of education and strengthen international collaboration in the field of children’s environmental literature, as well as increasing the mobility of students and teaching staff.
