
## **Development of educational resources**

**Proyecto Eco4** is an educational project focused on raising awareness and learning about the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). UIC Barcelona, with the collaboration of different educational organisations and the non-profit foundation Justicia i Pau, aims to create a network of educational institutions and entities that work together to promote integral ecology and global justice. The project encourages young people to overcome superficial changes and address the root causes of social and environmental challenges from a positive perspective. Dr Mariona Graells directed this methodological research from the transformation of social reality, vulnerability and the environment, which was carried out during the 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 academic years.



**A+Familias** is an association that provides debit cards to vulnerable families. The Joaquim Molins Figueras Chair of UIC Barcelona studies the impact of this aid on the well-being of families.

Service Learning is an educational proposal through which students are trained by participating in a project aimed at solving the real needs of a community to improve the living conditions of people or the quality of the environment. Academic objectives are linked to the resolution of social challenges.



During the 11th National and 5th International University Service Learning, UIC Barcelona presented some of its projects on university service learning. Among other projects is the Vincles (Connections), carried out with the non-profit association of the Casal dels Infants del Raval y Badalona. It is a mother-child space that accompanies 640 mothers and children under 3 years old at risk of social exclusion each year, helping to strengthen the maternal bond, the learning and habits of the children and the social and labour insertion of the participating women. Dr Maite Fuertes leads this research work linked to work placements and Service Learning (ApS).

Projects promoting reading or empowering women in rural areas of Guatemala were also presented, among others, as well as AIDIR Ciutat Vella Unit, the corporate social responsibility project promoted by the Nursing Department in its commitment to the health of the local population.

Kids Sustainability: is a project led by the Ignatianum University in Krakow (Poland), in which the universities LUMSA (Rome), the Polytechnic of Milan (Italy), Dublin City University (Ireland), and UIC Barcelona (Spain) collaborate. It aims to design learning resources for educators based on research for children aged 3 to 6 years that are focused on developing sustainability skills with an outdoor approach. The project repository houses practical learning resources designed to help teachers and parents identify and strengthen sustainability skills development practices and how to teach them.
